IL Governor Pritzker: Trump, Republicans Are Nazis, Can't Know Peace, Mobilize in Streets

In an apparent attempt to incite an insurrection and another assassination attempt on President Donald Trump, far-left Democrat Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker has again likened the Trump administration to the Nazi regime of Adolf Hitler.

Pritzker peddled the lie on far-left, hate-Trump MSNBC after a speech in New Hampshire. During that mostly forgettable oration, he said "Republicans cannot know a moment of peace" and that hate-Trump Americans must mobilize in the streets.

And Pritzker's remarks are not a one-off. Myriad Democrats have called for insurrection and protests and strongly suggested violence to oppose the Trump administration.

The Speech

Pritzker landed in New Hampshire at the McIntyre-Shaheen 100 Club Dinner likely because he views himself as a viable POTUS candidate in 2028.

"Never before in my life have I called for mass protests, for mobilization, for disruption," [he told](#) the Democrat worthies. "But I am now."

"These Republicans cannot know a moment of peace," the billionaire Hyatt Hotel heir fumed:

They have to understand that we will fight their cruelty with every megaphone and microphone that we have. We must castigate them on the soapbox and then punish them at the ballot box.

Fellow Democrats took it on the chin, too, for failing to firmly oppose Trump. Pritzker also likened



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Republicans to [Vidkun Quisling](#), Norway's Nazi-collaborationist president during World War II.

"We will never join so many Republicans in the special place in hell reserved for quislings and cowards," [Pritzker said](#). "We will relegate their portraits to the museum halls reserved for tyrants and traitors."

Pritzker raised his own bet on MSNBC, speaking to Jen Psaki, former mouthpiece for the Biden administration.

"Let me be clear, we're in a perilous moment in this country," the bloated governor said:

When you don't control Congress, when you don't control the White House, and people are feeling helpless and powerless, it's time for people to mobilize. And I wanted people to hear that they do have power.

Pritzker said his family landed in the United States from Ukraine after fleeing that country "when the Russians were killing Jews during the pogroms."

"What I feel, anyway, is that the dangers that my family experienced in Ukraine, the dangers that we saw in, you know, Nazi Germany, especially in the earliest days of Nazi Germany, are the dangers that we need to react to now," Pritzker averred:

If we don't, things will get much, much worse. And so we've got to raise alarm bells to everybody. It's a five-alarm fire everyone. It's time to step out of your comfort and step out into the streets.

[Pritzker claimed](#) that he isn't speculating about the danger of a Nazi regime because "I feel it in my bones, because I've seen this happen before."

Born in 1965, Pritzker hasn't "seen this happen before," but at any rate, the rant on MSNBC echoed his state budget speech in February.

"It took the Nazis one month, three weeks, two days, eight hours and 40 minutes to dismantle a constitutional republic," [Pritzker said](#):

All I'm saying is when the five-alarm fire starts to burn, every good person better be ready to man a post with a bucket of water if you want to stop it from raging out of control.

Other Lunatic Remarks

Pritzker is not alone. Myriad far-left Democrats have openly called for insurrection. Legal analyst



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Jonathan Turley [helpfully curated](#) some of the most deranged comments.

Most recently, U.S. Representative Frederica Wilson of Florida, who inexplicably wears a cowboy hat, visited an ICE detention center and quickly derailed into the far-left side of the Everglades.

“So I’ve been giving out the phone numbers to the House of Representatives and to the Senate. It’s one number that number you call and you threaten it, and you say, this is wrong,” she fumed:

This is not America. This is not what we stand for. We need a change. You have to do that. It’s going to take the people. We’ve done it.

We need the people. We needed an uprising where people are taking to the streets and the phones and writing letters. That’s what we need.

Despite the chapeau, Wilson isn’t a Lone Rangeress riding by herself.

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Representative Maxine Waters of California, known as Mad Max, raged on X:

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“We are going to fight it legislatively,” House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries said. “We are going to fight it in the courts. And we’re going to fight it in the streets.”

Dangerous Rhetoric

Republicans are concerned that the dangerous rhetoric, lately from Pritzker, will incite violence against the party, or worse, another attempt on Trump’s life.

“Pritzker’s reckless rhetoric is going to get someone killed,” the Chicago GOP wrote on X:

[Bernie Bro already took shots](#) at Congressmen & nearly killed Rep Steve Scalise. Pritzker’s words can incite violent activity way worse than Jan 6 ever was.

The city party reposted remarks from Cook County Commissioner Sean Morrison, who said Pritzker “crossed a dangerous line.” The governor is “grossly irresponsible,” Morrison wrote, and his words are not “ordinary political hyperbole.... It is the language that triggers violence.”
