



Trump Advisor Peter Navarro Sentenced to Four Months for Contempt of Congress

U.S. District Judge Amit Mehta <u>sentenced</u>

<u>Peter Navarro to four months in prison</u>

<u>today</u>. The federal judge also imposed a

\$9,500 fine. Prosecutors had requested that
the judge sentence Navarro to six months in
prison and fine him \$200,000.

Navarro was convicted of contempt of Congress after not cooperating with the congressional investigation into the events on January 6, 2021.

Navarro was a trade advisor to former President Donald Trump, and was subpoenaed by Congress after he allegedly worked with Trump to overturn the results of the 2020 presidential election.
