



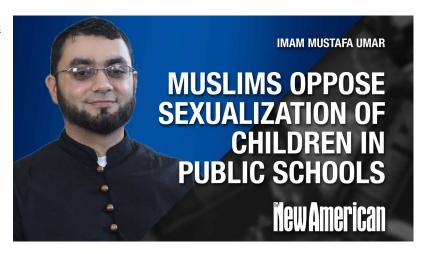
## Muslims Oppose Sexualization of Children in Public Schools: Islamic Leader
