While it may be difficult for students not actually involved in the protests and counter-protests to take

seriously such episodes, the reality is that it is very serious. It is guite clear that from the East Coast (Charlottesville, Virginia) to the West Coast (Berkeley, California), radical leftists, such as Antifa, are determined to prevent students and others from even hearing an alternative viewpoint to leftist

Mike Isaacson, a founder of the Smash Racism "Antifa" organization in Washington, has explained the radical leftist viewpoint: "There is the question of whether these people should feel safe organizing as Nazis in public, and I don't think they should.... I don't think that is something that we should protect."

Of course, it should be noted that it has long been a common tactic of the Left to dismiss those with whom it disagrees as either Nazis, Fascists, or the Ku Klux Klan. That way they can then justify denying

"If you look at them, it's ridiculous," David Marguis, a senior at the University of California, Berkeley, told the Los Angeles *Times.* "You've got a guy with purple hair with a f***** lightsaber talking about Hitler. It's hard for me to take any of this seriously."

Marquis is quite understandably weary of the continuing protests on the campus, but the reality is, this is serious. Left-wing radicals across the country, not just at Cal, a school that has long held a very liberal reputation, are determined to use force to shut down opposing viewpoints.

the right of free speech and free assembly to its opposition, as happened in Berkeley on the University of California campus.

When most Americans hear the terms "white supremacists," "neo-Nazis," and "fascists," they probably imagine Klan members wearing white sheets, Adolf Hitler, and Benito Mussolini, and it is, in fact, the Left's intention to associate those groups with the political Right. But the reality is that those groups have more in common with the Left than with the Right. After all, Hitler's political party was the *National Socialist* party (Nazi being shorthand for National Socialist), while Mussolini once edited a socialist newspaper. And the ideology of the Klan is hardly conservative.

Unfortunately, such violent confrontations as happened in Berkeley, when allowed by either college authorities or local law enforcement (usually at the direction of their liberal superiors at City Hall), have the effect of advancing the cause of Marxist socialists such as Antifa. And that is why such violent confrontations, even when instigated by ridiculous-looking participants with purple hair and lightsabers, are quite serious.
