Leftist Congresswoman Says GOP Wants to "Kill Women"

Rep. Louise Slaughter, a leftist Democrat from New York, claims the latest group of Republican Congressmen were sent to Washington so they can kill women.

Speaking at a rally for "women's health" sponsored by Planned Parenthood, the National Organization for Women, and the National Abortion Rights Action League, Slaughter was referring to a bill in Congress to stop taxpayer funding for abortion, which would curtail subsidies for groups such as Planned Parenthood, the largest abortion factory in America.



<u>CNSnews.com caught</u> Slaughter <u>on tape</u> uttering the calumny:

This is probably one of the worst times weve seen because the numbers of people elected to Congress. I went through this as co-chair of the arts caucus. In 94 people were elected simply to come here to kill the National Endowment for the Arts. Now theyre here to kill women.

But Slaughter didn't stop there. She then compared Republicans to Nazis, the <u>CNSNews.com</u> tape and <u>report revealed</u>:

You are allowed to have an abortion if you have been raped or its a matter of incest. However, you have to keep a receipt. Did you know that? Its sort of like an old German Nazi movie. Show me your papers!

No Taxpayer Abortion Act

Slaughter was speaking about the <u>No Taxpayer Funding For Abortion Act</u>, or H.R. 3, introduced by Reps. <u>Chris Smith</u> (R-N.J.) and <u>Dan Lipinski</u> (D-Ill.). <u>According to</u> the Congressional Research Service, the bill would cut off almost all taxpayer funding of abortions. Pro-abortion leftists tried to stop the measure because of a dispute over its definition of "rape," a nettlesome issue in the abortion debate.

H.R. 3 would make permanent the restrictions on taxpayer-funded abortion contained the the <u>Hyde</u> <u>Amendment</u>, which became law in 1976 and is annually renewed as a rider to appropriations bills.

Planned Parenthood has good reason to be worried. The nationwide abortion provider <u>receives some</u> \$363 million annually from the taxpayers, and with that money, murders millions of unborn children in the womb. In 2008 alone, <u>Planned Parenthood performed</u> 324,008 abortions.

Beyond that, Planned Parenthood can't explain where all its tax money goes. For instance, <u>the</u> <u>Government Accountability office reported</u> that between 2002 and 2008 <u>PP collected</u> more than \$2 billion in federal funds, but only \$657.1 million was spent. That raises the question, the <u>American Life</u> <u>League says</u> in its summary of the GAO findings, of what happened to the rest of the funds.

As <u>The New American reported</u> in February, Planned Parenthood's mishandling funds is old news. In 1973, the <u>GAO reported</u> that its international affiliate's expenditure of tax money needs better oversight.

As for Slaughter, after leftist Jared Loughner's mass shooting in Tucson in January, the leftist Democrat announced that the Federal Communications Commission is not working anymore, <u>The Hill</u> <u>reported</u>, <u>adding that</u> Slaughter vowed to "look at ways to better police language on the airwaves."
